# **NE BOCES Colorado Local Accountability System Grant**

The CREC is excited to support the Northeast BOCES with implementation of their Colorado Local Accountability System Grant from CDE. This project serves three rural Colorado school districts: Peetz Plateau, Revere, and Yuma. Specifically, this project will:



- Create a stakeholder-focused accountability dashboard that clearly shows the students, parents, educators, and community the growth and achievement of students so this information can be used to drive instructional change;
- Adapt and align the Unified Improvement Plan to NWEA measurements to create local goals that are specific, measurable, attainable, research-based, and timely by creating a dedicated accountability website that includes NWEA data as a supplemental performance framework.

# **Social Emotional Learning & At-Risk Students**

Amidst the COVID-19 crisis, ensuring every student receives SEL support became a major need for districts. Throughout the past year, all school districts/organizations implementing GSN's SEL programming had the opportunity to share resources and ideas in the community space, and problem solve collaboratively. Although data collection was limited due to the COVID-19 pandemic, positive trends from SEL programming continued:



- 100% of all responding **students** feel that they have gained skills for school, work, and life through their Advocacy/SEL lessons.
- 86% of **students** surveyed perceive their Advocacy/SEL group to be a safe space.
- 98% of teachers surveyed feel that they have developed meaningful relationships with their Advocacy/SEL students.
- 97% of **teachers** feel that culture and climate are positively affected by a successful Advocacy/SEL program.


