Grant services will focus on the 15% of students most at risk. The risk factors that are the focus of the EARSS grant are student behaviors resulting in disciplinary action and absenteeism resulting in truancy.

USDA and four of its partners are now accepting applications from rural communities and regions for free technical assistance to implement economic development planning projects. Through the Rural Economic Development Innovation (REDI) initiative, USDA is partnering to provide this assistance with the National Association of Counties, Rural Community Assistance Partnership, McClure Engineering Company, Purdue University Extension/ Community & Economic Development Initiative of Kentucky.

Participation in REDI will enable a rural community, or region, to create economic development plans that include: evidence-based assessments, quantifiable goals, plans to improve the local and regional economy, and metrics to track implementation and progress.

Salida High School Teacher Leads Mindfulness Activities with Students During Salida High School SEL walkthroughs, GSN staff members Ellen Sarkisian and Ashleigh Valentine had the pleasure of watching Nick Griffin implement a mindfulness lesson with his high school students. First, Griffin played a video called <u>The Time You Have (In JellyBeans)</u> that initiated a powerful discussion with students about the use of our time and how important it is to pursue things that we love to do. Following the conversation, Griffin led a mindfulness activity with his students in a circle. Students were very engaged and self-aware as Nick provided guided instructions. From the moment Sarkisian and Valentine walked into the classroom, it was evident that students had a great rapport with their teacher and fellow peers. Way to go, Salida High School!

Case Study: Evolution of Team Teaching - Strategies for Individualizing Learning

Wiggins is a small rural district that has made team teaching a strategic priority, with the goal of individualizing learning for each and every student. With the state's support through the Colorado Empowered Learning program, Wiggins was able to enhance and evolve its team teaching strategy to further meet the needs of students. Teachers received professional development on blended learning techniques and have begun integrating digital components into their team teaching and day-to-day instructional strategies. As teacher's have gained comfort with these techniques, the district is also taking advantage of Colorado's Digital Content Warehouse, customizing not just their teaching approach, but also the content taught, to better reflect student needs and interests.
