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

Pandemic - EBT Application Process Now Open

The Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS), in collaboration with CDE is pleased to announce the Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) application can be accessed through late September. To support families during the COVID-19 epidemic, CDHS and CDE secured USDA approval to issue P-EBT benefits to school aged children who would have received free or reduced-price meals when schools were closed. It is also for children who would have been eligible in March, April or May due to loss of income.



Each household with an eligible child can receive an amount of \$5.70 per child per school day on a Colorado EBT card. Benefits were auto-issued for families participating in SNAP. Families who were not auto-issued benefits should apply. Access the application, FAQs and more information here.

Santa Fe Trail North Star Planning Meeting

Generation Schools Network is gearing up to host the second North Star Planning Meeting in late September/early October alongside its partners Battelle for Kids and the Santa Fe Trail BOCES. This meeting is the second in the four-part North Star Planning Meeting series, which aims to bolster the college and career pathway created by the Santa Fe Trail BOCES and its six member districts (Cheraw, Las Animas, La Junta, Rocky Ford, Swink, and Wiley). During this meeting, local stakeholders will gather to build upon the three skills that community members identified as being most important to instill in students



To address this issue, several districts applied for funding through two CDE Computer Science grants, a computer coding program, <u>BitsBox</u>, will provide experience and exposure for 4th-8th graders with a weekly class involving high quality, fun and engaging curriculum and projects. The teachers leading the class will benefit from a monthly state-wide PLC with experienced BitsBox teachers to build capacity in computer science, confidence in teaching and

collaboration with other teachers, culminating in a Basics Coding Certificate. Teachers may choose to apply for the summer scholarship fund to continue their education in the field.
