I-76 Corridor Convening Selects North Star Skills for Students!



GSN successfully hosted an I-76 collaboration meeting in Wiggins earlier this month. This meeting brought together superintendents, principals, teachers, students, business members, and community members from six respective communities. The collaboration consists of six school districts: Brush, Morgan County, Platte Valley, Weld RE3J, Weldon Valley, and Wiggins. The goal of this meeting was to answer this overarching question: "What is the mismatch between skills students graduate with and skills local employers want?" Through careful deliberation and discussion, the six regions identified three needed skills. These three main skills, also called North Star Skills, are: communication, leadership, and integrity. As GSN builds out college and career readiness programming with these districts, they will also ensure that these north star skills are embedded in these programs.

Social Emotional Learning & Students At-Risk



Amidst the COVID-19 crisis, ensuring every student receives SEL support became a major need for districts. Throughout the past year, all school districts/organizations implementing GSN's SEL programming had the opportunity to share resources and ideas throughout the community, and problem solve collaboratively. Although data collection was limited due to the COVID-19 pandemic, positive trends from SEL programming continued:

- 100% of all responding students feel that they have gained skills for school, work, and life through their Advocacy/SEL lessons.
- 86% of students surveyed perceive their Advocacy/SEL group to be a safe space.

- 98% of teachers surveyed feel that they have developed meaningful relationships with their Advocacy/SEL students.
- 97% of teachers feel that culture and climate are positively affected by a successful Advocacy/SEL program.

Bullying Prevention and Education (BPEG) & Expelled and At-Risk Student Services (EARSS) Grant Opportunities Available!



The Colorado School Bullying Prevention and Education Grant Program (BPEG) is authorized to provide funding to reduce the frequency of bullying incidents. This includes:

- 1. Implementing evidence-based bullying prevention practices with fidelity;
- 2. Family and community involvement in school bullying prevention strategies;
- 3. Adopting specific policies concerning bullying education and prevention;
- 4. Using data to effectively problem solve local bullying concerns;
- 5. Developing/Adopting a team at each school to lead the bullying prevention

The Expelled and At-Risk Student Services (EARSS) Grant seeks to reduce the incidence of attendance and behavior referrals, which are risk factors for dropping out of school. The EARSS grant program provides targeted intervention and educational services support directly to students who become expelled or suspended (but are still served by the district), are at-risk of being expelled or suspended, and/or are chronically absent.
